THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

V. Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee.


VI. Thou shalt not kill.

Lesson For Sabbath, July 4, 2009

FATHERS

Scripture Reading: John 17. Golden Text: Ephesians 6:4.

1. What are sons to receive from their fathers? Proverbs 1:8; 4:1.

2. Did the Lord know that Abraham would instruct his children? Genesis 18:17-19.

3. How did Paul describe his relationship with Timothy? I Timothy 1:1-2; 4:11-15.

NOTE: Paul's epistle to Timothy is full of instructions. As his "spiritual" father, Paul was trying to encourage the young Timothy and help him with his new ministry.

4. What did David tell Solomon? Proverbs 4:2-4, 10-13.

6. What will a wise son accomplish? Proverbs 10:1 (first part); 13:1 (first part).

7. What does a foolish son become? Proverbs 19:13 (first part); 10:1 (second part).

8. What happens to children of a man who walks in integrity? Proverbs 20:7.

9. What will happen to one who curses his father or mother? Proverbs 20:20; Exodus 21:17; Leviticus 20:9.

10. To what does the father compare honey and the honeycomb? Proverbs 24:13-14.

NOTE: This wisdom will bring truth and peace. See Philippians 4:7.

1. Who taught King Lemuel? Proverbs 31:1.

2. What was the prophecy or teaching? Proverbs 31:2-9.

3. When Paul wrote to Timothy, who are we told were examples in his life? II Timothy 1:1-5.

4. What will a child left to himself bring to his mother? Proverbs 29:15; 19:26.

5. What are we told NOT to do when our mother is old? Proverbs 23:22 (last part).

11. What other capabilities does a virtuous woman have? Proverbs 31:13-31.

Lesson For Sabbath, July 25, 2009

10. Are we better off with a little or a lot? Proverbs 15:16; 16:8; Psalm 37:16.

Lesson For Sabbath, August 15, 2009

WORK

Scripture Reading: Ecclesiastes 3. Golden Text: Ecclesiastes 9:10.

1. How is wicked work and righteous work compared? Proverbs 11:18; Hosea 10:12-13.

2. Who is related to one that is slothful? Proverbs 18:9.
