
Lesson For Sabbath, September 30, 2023 JEREMIAH PART VIII

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 31:1-17. Golden Text: Romans 9:27.

- 1. Will God make a new covenant with the house of Israel? Jeremiah 31:31.
- 2. Why a new covenant? Hebrews 8:1-8.
- 3. What did Israel do under the old covenant? Jeremiah 31:32; Hebrews 8:9.
- 4. How will this covenant be different? Jeremiah 31:33; Hebrews 8:10.
- 5. Will teaching others be necessary? Jeremiah 31:34; Hebrews 8:11-13.
- 6. What will we see in the future? Zechariah 8:20-23.
- 7. What else? Zechariah 12:1-3.
- 8. Where will Jesus return? Acts 1:6-12; Zechariah 14:1-4.
- 9. What will happen to the house of David? Zechariah 12:10-11.

10. What physical scars identify Jesus for Israel? Zechariah 13:6.

Lesson For Sabbath, July 1, 2023

AMOS

Scripture Reading: Amos 3. Golden Text: Amos 3:7.

NOTE: Amos, whose name means burdensome, was given the task of prophesying to Israel. He primarily spoke to the Northern tribes but includes the whole family of Jacob.

- 1. Who is Amos? Amos 1:1; 7:14-15.
- 2. What is the Lord going to do? Amos 1:2; 7:15-17.
- 3. How does Amos get their attention? Amos 1:3-10. *NOTE: These are surroundings peoples.*
- 4. He continues. Amos 1:11-15; 2:1-3.
- 5. After getting their attention by using their enemies, what is his message to Judah? Amos 2:4-5.
- 6. Is his message to Israel different? Amos 2:6-8.
- 7. Of what does the Lord remind them? Amos 2:9-10.

NOTE: The Amorites were at the height of their power but the Lord destroyed them.

8. How did the Lord prepare Isarel to battle the Amorites in the past? Deuteronomy 2:24-25.

NOTE: Israel forgot what the Lord did for them as recorded in Deuteronomy and seemed to think they accomplished everything on their own.

- 9. What does Amaziah the priest tell Amos to do? Amos 7:10-13.
- 10. After contending with Israel through Amos, what will happen? Amos 8:11-12.

Lesson For Sabbath, July 8, 2023 HOSEA

Scripture Reading: Hosea 10.

Golden Text: Hosea 4:1.

NOTE: Hosea was a contemporary of Amos. His name means deliverer. Israel has been an adulteress wife and the Lord uses Hosea to bring that message home.

- 1. What does the Lord tell Hosea to do? Hosea 1:1-2.
- 2. Who does he select? Hosea 1:3.

NOTE: Gomer means completion. Hosea completed his task representing fallen Israel.

- 3. What was the first child named and what did he represent? Hosea 1:4-5.
- 4. After Gomer bare a daughter, what do we read? Hosea 1:6.
- 5. What is said of the House of Judah at this time? Hosea 1:7. *NOTE: Israel, the ten northern tribes, went into captivity first.*
- 6. Did Gomer bare another child? Hosea 1:8-9.

NOTE: Through the prophet the Lord shows the doctrine and destruction of Israel.

- 7. Why did all this happen? Hosea 4:6.
- 8. How will they abide many days? Hosea 3:4.

NOTE: Teraphim means idols.

9. Will Israel be restored? Hosea 2:14-16.

NOTE: The footnote says Ishi means husband and Baali means Lord.

10. What else will happen? Hosea 2:17-23.

Lesson For Sabbath, July 15, 2023

JOEL

Scripture Reading: Joel 2:1-17.

Golden Text: Joel 2:11.

NOTE: Joel was a prophet to Judah and writes about the plagues of insects.

- 1. The Lord is chastening Judah. What do we learn? Joel 1:1-7; 18-20.
- 2. What does Joel 2:1 refer to? Revelation 19:11-16.
- 3. How does Peter write about the same thing? II Peter 3:10. *NOTE: God promises blessings and help to the godly.*
- 4. What happens to the unjust? II Peter 2:9.

NOTE: Judah has followed the same path of the northern ten tribes and will suffer.

- 5. Joel prophesizes about the end times when Jesus returns. Joel 2:1,10,11.
- 6. What is the Lord hoping for? Joel 2:12-14.
- 7. What else does Joel teach? Joel 2:28-29.
- 8. Is Joel quoted in Acts? Acts 2:14-18.
- 9. Do we read something similar in Zechariah? Zechariah 12:10.
- 10. How is the full kingdom blessing presented? Joel 3:17-21.

Lesson For Sabbath, July 22, 2023

ISAIAH

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 1:1-20.

Golden Text: Isaiah 1:2.

NOTE: According to Scofield, Isaiah is considered the chief of the writing prophets.

1. Who does Isaiah's vision concern? Isiaah 1:1.

NOTE: The northern ten tribes have already been taken captive and Isaiah is trying to keep the rest of the Israelites, Judah, from suffering the same fate.

- 2. Does he try to reason with them? Isaiah 1:18-19.
- 3. If they refuse? Isaiah 1:20.
- 4. Is the reader given a description of the problems at that time? Isaiah 1:21-24.
- 5. What can happen if they turn from their evil deeds? Isaiah 1:25-28. *NOTE: The Lord is consistent and promises to reward obedience and punish the wicked.*
- 6. What do the six woes upon Israel tell us? Isaiah 5:8, 11, 18, 20-23.
- 7. Does the Prophet write about the Messiah? Isiaah 7:14-16. *NOTE:* While he is predicting the birth of Jesus, he is also predicting Judah's demise. Re-read verse 16.
- 8. Did the Lord testify against Israel and Judah II Kings 17:13-15.
- 9. What happened? II Kings 17:18-20, 24.
- 10. Isaiah 4:1-6 describes the vision of the future kingdom.

Lesson For Sabbath, July 29, 2023

ISAIAH PART II

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 6. Golden Text: Acts 3:19.

- 1. After Isaiah had a vision, did he consider himself worthy? Isaiah 6:5.
- 2. How was his sin purged? Isaiah 6:6-7.
- 3. Was he ready now? Isaiah 6:8.
- 4. How receptive was his audience to be when he warned them? Isaiah 6:9-10.
- 5. Is this referenced in the New Testament? Matthew 13:13-15; Acts 28:25-27.

NOTE: Isaiah, Jesus and Paul experienced the reaction to their preaching. While our preaching is not to Isarel, we experience similar reaction.

- 6. Isaiah asks, how long will he be preaching this message? Isaiah 6:11-12.
- 7. Does the prophet write about the Messiah again? Isaiah 9:6-7.
- 8. How is He received when He arrives? Isaiah 53:1-3.
- 9. While Jesus was rejected by His own, what are the characteristics of His reign? Isaiah 11:1-5.
- 10. What will be the quality of His kingdom? Isaiah 11:6-9.

Lesson For Sabbath, August 5, 2023

ISAIAH PART III

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 40:1-17.

Golden Text: Isaiah 41:10.

1. Who is the voice of him that crieth in the wilderness? Isaiah 40:3; Matthew 3:1-3; Mark 1:1-4.

- 2. Can anything be compared to God? Isaiah 40:18-22.
- 3. Is anyone equal to God? Isaiah 40:25-30. *NOTE:* No one is equal to God, no one can keep up with God or is comparable to God.
- 4. What will happen to those who wait on the Lord? Isaiah 40:31.
- 5. In chapter 41 what does Isaiah write about Israel? Isaiah 41:8-10.
- 6. What will happen to those who were incensed against Israel? Isaiah 41:11-12.
- 7. Should Israel have any fear at that time? Isaiah 41:13-14.
- 8. Matthew writes that all the prophets and the law prophesied until who? Matthew 11:13; Luke 16:16.

NOTE: The prophets and the law refers to the Old Testament.

- 9. What was John's mission John 1:6-8.
- 10. What was his message? Matthew 3:1-2.
- 11. Did Jesus have the same message? Matthew 4:23; 9:35.

Lesson For Sabbath, August 12, 2023

JEREMIAH

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 1. Golden Text: Jeremiah 1:5.

NOTE: Jeremiah was set apart, sanctified, for a specific purpose.

- 1. What is part of his first message to Judah? Jeremiah 2:1-5.
- 2. What two evils did the people commit? Jeremiah 2:13.
- 3. Does Jeremiah compare Israel to a thief that is ashamed? Jeremiah 2:26-28.
- 4. How does his second message start? Jeremiah 3:6. *NOTE: The Lord hoped Judaah would learn from the mistakes of the ten tribles of Israel.*
- 5. What happens? Jeremiah 3:7-11.
- 6. Does the prophet try to get them to return to the Lord? Jeremiah 3:12-15.

NOTE: Judah follows in the footsteps of her "sister" who played the harlot.

- 7. Are the people reminded of their history? Isaiah 1:11; Jeremiah 7:22-23; Exodus 15:26; Jeremiah 11:1-4.
- 8. How does Jeremiah present the Lord's creative ability? Jeremiah 10:12-13.
- 9. How does the prophet write about his reaction if they won't listen or fear? Jeremiah 13:15-17.
- 10. Does Jesus have a similar reaction concerning Jerusalem? Luke 19:41-44.

Lesson For Sabbath, August 19, 2023 JEREMIAH PART II

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 14:1-10. Golden Text: Isaiah 59:7.

1. Was Jeremiah to pray for these people? Jeremiah 14:11-12.

2. While Moses and Samuel stood before the Lord, what will happen to these people? Jeremiah 15:1-4.

NOTE: The Lord has used the prophets to plead with His people. No wonder He called them stiff-necked.

- 3. When Isaiah asks them to awake, what else does he say? Isaiah 51:17-20.
- 4. What will they hear? Isaiah 51:21-23.
- 5. Why does the Lord tell Jeremiah not to marry? Jeremiah 16:1-4.
- 6. Was the prophet to enter into the house of mourning? Jeremiah 16:5-7.
- 7. Was he to enter the house of feasting? Jeremiah 16:8-9.
- 8. When the people ask what is our sin, what were they told? Jeremiah 16:10-12.
- 9. What will their punishment be? Jeremiah 16:13-15.
- 10. How serious is their sin? Jeremiah 17:1-4.

NOTE: It is our hope that we listen and learn from other's mistakes and not repeat them.

Lesson For Sabbath, August 26, 2023

JEREMIAH PART III

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 17:5-18. Golden Text: Proverbs 3:5.

- 1. What was Jeremiah's message in the gates? Jeremiah 17:19-22.
- 2. What did the Lord promise? Jeremiah 17:24-26.
- 3. Did they listen? Jeremiah 17:23.
- 4. As a result of not listening what happened? Jeremiah 17:27.

NOTE: Sometimes what seems to be a smaller sin, there is no such thing, can bring down a kingdom. Breaking the sabbath is not insignificant.

- 5. Where was Jeremiah told to go? Jeremiah 18:1-4.
- 6. To what is Israel compared? Jeremiah 18:5-6.

NOTE: During Jeremiah's time they would not listen, but Isaiah writes they will have a different attitude in the future. Isaiah 64:8.

- 7. Because of their actions what will the valley of Hinnom be called? Jeremiah 19:1-6.
- 8. When Pashur the chief governor heard what Jeremiah prophesied, what did he do? Jeremiah 20:1-2.
- 9. Did Jeremiah stop prophesying? Jeremiah 20:3-6.
- 10. Why was Jeremiah born? Jeremiah 1:5.

Lesson For Sabbath, September 2, 2023 JEREMIAH PART IV

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 22:1-17. Golden Text: Jeremiah 23:1.

- 1. While the Lord says that the pastors have scattered his flock, what will happen in the future? Jeremiah 23:2-4.
- 2. Who else will appear? Jeremiah 23:5-6.
- 3. How does Isaiah describe His reign? Isaiah 11:1-5.
- 4. John in Revelation. Revelation 19:11-16. NOTE: In Isaiah 11:3, Isaiah writes, "not after the sight of his eyes or after the hearing of His ears." No knee jerk reaction here but with righteousness.
- 5. How does Jeremiah describe God? Jeremiah 23:23-24.

NOTE: The Lord saw and heard the false prophets.

- 6. What does Jeremiah write about these prophets? Jeremiah 23:25-27.
- 7. How does the Lord want His prophets to be? Jeremiah 23:28-29.
- 8. What is the Lord against? Jeremiah 23:30-32.
- 9. After multiple pleading what is pronounced on the people? Jeremiah 25:8-10.
- 10. How long will this captivity last? Jeremiah 25:11-14.

Lesson for Sabbath, September 9, 2023

JEREMIAH PART V

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 26:1-11. Golden Text: Psalm 12:6.

1. How does Jeremiah defend his speech? Jeremiah 26:12.

NOTE: He tries to explain that he is just the messenger.

- 2. Does Jesus explain something similar? John 14:10.
- 3. When Jeremiah speaks again what does he say? Jeremiah 26:13.
- 4. What does he say about himself? Jeremiah 26:14-15.
- 5. What do the princes realize? Jeremiah 26:16-19.
- 6. Was Urijah as fortunate as Jeremiah? Jeremiah 26:20-24.
- 7. What is the prophet to do next? Jermiah 27:1-5.
- 8. Now that He has their attention what does the Lord pronounce through the prophet? Jeremiah 27:6-8.
- 9. Who have they listened to? Jeremiah 27:9-10.
- 10. What will happen to the nations that bring their neck under the yoke? Jeremiah 27:11.

Lesson For Sabbath, September 16, 2023

JEREMIAH PART VI

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 27:12-22. Golden Text: Romans 3:4.

- 1. Were the people listening to false prophets? Jeremiah 27:14-15. *NOTE: Jeremiah was telling them the truth but they chose not to listen to him. Apparently they did not like his message.*
- 2. What were they told to do? Jeremiah 27:17.
- 3. Did Jehoiakim continue to serve the King of Babylon? II Kings 24:1.
- 4. Was prophesy fulfilled? II Kings 20:17-18; II Kings 24:2.
- 5. What was written about the vessels for the temple? Jeremiah 27:19-22.
- 6. How is this history recorded in Daniel? Daniel 1:1-2.
- 7. What did Belshazzar do with the temple vessels? Daniel 5:1-4. *NOTE: He took the vessels consecrated for the temple and used them for pagan worship.*
- 8. Who did God use to return the vessels to Jerusalem? Isaiah 44:28.
- 9. How does Cyrus start this process? Ezra 1:1-2, 7-11. *NOTE: He makes a proclamation and puts it in writing.*
- 10. Did Darius confirm the decree of Cyrus? Ezra 6:1-5, 15.

Lesson For Sabbath, September 23, 2023

JEREMIAH PART VII

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 29:1-14. Golden Text: Isaiah 55:11.

- 1. How did Jeremiah communicate with the people after their captivity? Jeremiah 29:1.
- 2. What was the main message of his letter? Jeremiah 29:10.
- 3. What will happen to those who did not go into captivity? Jeremiah 29:16-19.
- 4. Will some people be slain for their lies? Jeremiah 29:20-23.
- 5. Who else lied to the people? Jeremiah 29:24-26, 30,31.
- 6. How will he, Shemaiah, be punished? Jeremiah 29:32.
- 7. After Pharaoh's army returns to Egypt, what will happen? Jeremiah 37:6-10.
- 8. What does Jeremiah do at this time? Jeremiah 37:12-14.
- 9. How is he treated? Jeremiah 37:15-16.
- 10. Does Zedekiah treat him differently? Jeremiah 37:17-21.
